# Right Turn, Left Turn

Instructions  
in English

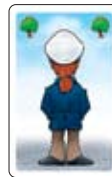
For 2 to 8 players, Ages 6 to Adult  
Playing Time: Approx. 10 minutes

**Contents:** 50 cards

43 Direction cards



7 Traffic Officer/Destination cards



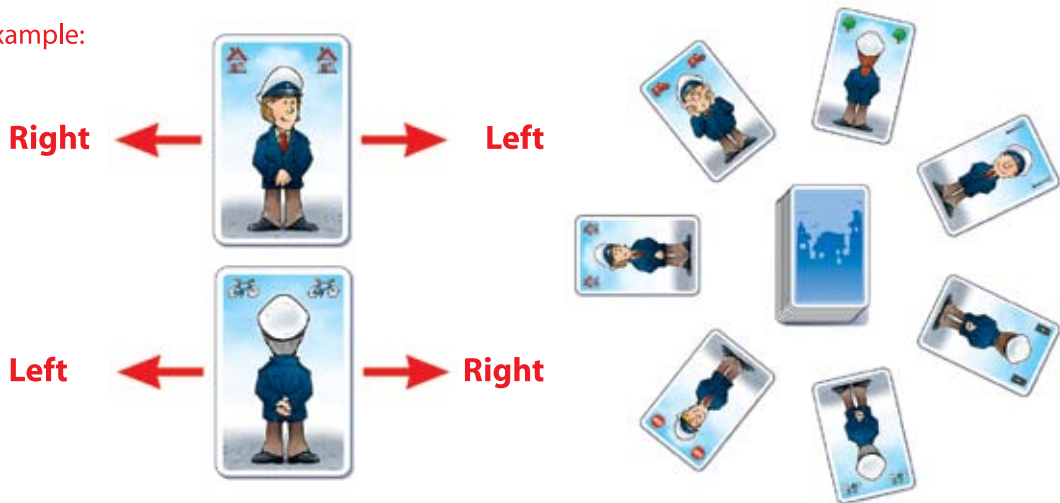
## Object of the Game:

On each card there is a Traffic Officer, along with a symbol representing a Destination. The Officer cards are arranged in a circle on the table. Players will see the Officer either from the front or from the back. Starting from the Officer with the symbol that matches the Direction card, 3 directions must be followed - sometimes they go to the left, sometimes to the right. The challenge is for players to determine which way is left or right from the Officer's point of view. This is determined by noticing which way the Officer is facing, either towards the players or away from them. The first player to call out the symbol on the final Destination card after the 3 movements receives that Direction card as a point. The player with the most Direction cards at the end of the game is the winner!

## Set up:

The 7 Officer cards are randomly placed face up on the table and arranged in a circle. The feet of the Officers always point towards the center of the circle (See Diagram). The 21 Direction cards are shuffled and placed face down in the center of the circle.

## Game Play:

Any player flips the top card of the Direction deck. On the card, a symbol and three directions are shown, which must be executed in order. The symbol determines from which Officer the three directions will begin. Each player figures out (without speaking aloud or using their hands), to which card the three directions will lead. As soon as a player figures out which card it is, they immediately call the name of the symbol, which is shown on the destination card.



*For Example:*

*The journey begins from the card with the House.*

*From here we move 3 cards to the Officer's left; one lands on the card with the Streetlight.*

*Now 1 card to the Officer's right; one lands on the card with the Tree.*

*Now 4 cards to the Officer's left; one lands finally, on the card with the Bicycle.*

*The correct response is to call aloud: "BICYCLE".*

Whoever calls the correct response first gets the Direction card. The card is stored on the table in front of that player. If a player should call a wrong answer, then that player is out of the round and must discard a previously won card as a penalty. The game continues with a new Direction card. The top Direction card is turned over, all follow the directions, someone calls the response first, and so on.

### **End of Game:**

The player who wins 6 Direction cards first is the winner! If nobody should win 6 Direction cards, then the player with the most Direction cards, when they are all gone, wins.

### **Wanna Play Again?**

Switch the order of the Traffic Officer cards in the circle and shuffle the Direction card deck for a completely new game!
